

## Ground Rules for Tel Mond Field for Cadet League Play

## 02 December 2018

## **TMFGR 0101**

- (a) Home plate will be in the north-east corner of the playing area, the rear tip aligned with:
  - First base side: the first pole after the white concrete wall;
  - Third base side: the third fence poll.
- (b) The foul lines will be marked with cones from 10 feet past third base and until the outfield fence and from 10 feet past first base and a reasonable distance towards the end of the field.
- (c) The entire field is in play except:
  - (1) The permanent soccer goal in foul territory near third base;
  - (2) Any other large field equipment in fair or foul territory;
  - (3) The area directly behind the David Levi monument in center field;
  - (4) The tree in center field that is planted inside the fence.

## **TMFGR 0506**

- (a) If a thrown ball hits, enters or goes through the soccer goal or net, the ball is dead and runners will be awarded bases under Official Baseball Rule 5.06 (b) (4) G.
- (b) If a thrown ball hits or enters any large field equipment in foul territory, the ball is dead and runners will be awarded bases under Official Baseball Rule 5.06 (b) (4) G.
- (c) If a fair batted ball hits or enters into any large field equipment or goes behind the David Levi monument in center field or hits any part of the tree planted in center field on the inside of the fence or bounds into the shed areas, the ball is dead. Runners including the batter-runner are awarded bases under Official Baseball Rule 5.06 (b) (4) F.
- (d) The light poles in fair territory are in play as is the un-used dugout in center field. Any batted balls that hit the light poles or the dugout are live.
  - (1) If a fly ball hits a light pole in fair territory and then deflects over the outfield fence will be a home run.
  - (2) If a batted ball hits the roof of the dugout and bounds over the outfield fence. Runners including the batter-runner will be awarded bases under Official Baseball Rule 5.06 (b) (4) F.
  - (3) The light poles and the indent in foul territory down the first base line are in play. A fair batted ball or a thrown ball that hits them is live.

- (e) If a batted ball hits any of the trees planted behind that portion of the outfield fence in fair territory it is a home run regardless if the ball deflected back into the field.
- (f) If a batted ball hits the roof of one of the sheds it is a home run.
- (g) If a batted ball hits a wall and rebounds back into the field it is live.
