

# Ground Rules for Tel Mond Field for Cadet League Play

01 December 2018

## TMF 01

Home plate will be in the north-east corner of the playing area, the rear tip aligned with:

- First base side: the first pole after the white concrete wall
- Third base side: the third fence poll.

## TMF 02

The foul lines will be marked with cones from 10 feet past third base and until the outfield fence and from 10 feet past first base and a reasonable distance towards the end of the field

## **TMF 03**

The entire field is in play except:

- (a) The permanent soccer goal in foul territory near third base
- (b) Any other large field equipment in fair or foul territory
- (c) The area directly behind the David Levi monument in center field
- (d) The tree in center field that is planted inside the fence.

Should a thrown ball hit, enter or go through the soccer goal or net it will be a dead ball and runners will be awarded bases according to OBR 5.06 (b) (4) G.

Should a thrown ball hit or enter any large field equipment in foul territory, it will be a dead ball and runners will be awarded bases according to OBR 5.06 (b) (4) G

If a fair batted ball hits or enters into any large field equipment or goes behind the David Levi monument in center field or hits any part of the tree planted in center field on the inside of the fence or bounds into the shed areas, it will be a dead ball and the batter and all runners awarded bases according to rule 5.06 (b) (4) F

## **TMF 04**

The light poles in fair territory are in play as is the un-used dugout in center field, and any batted balls that hit the light poles or the dugout are live.

- (a) If a batted ball hits a light pole on fair territory on a fly and then deflects over the outfield fence it will be a homerun.
- (b) If a batted ball hits the roof of the dugout and bounds over the outfield fence, the batter and all runners will be awarded bases according to OBR 5.06 (b) (4) F
- (c) The light poles and the indent in foul territory down the first base line are in play and a fair batted ball or a thrown ball that hits them is live.

#### **TMF 05**

If a batted ball hits any of the trees planted behind that portion of the outfield fence in fair territory it is a homerun regardless if the ball deflected back into the field.

**TMF 06** 



If a batted ball hits the roof of one of the sheds it is a homerun. If it hits a wall and rebounds back into the field it is live.
